

Worthington Primary school Pupil premium funding 2018/19

“Pupil Premium” is government funding which is currently allocated to all schools.

The level of this funding is determined by:

- The number of children from low-income families who are currently known to be eligible for free school meals (FSM)
- The number of children who have been ‘looked after’ continuously by Social Services for more than six months
- The number of children who have been in receipt of FSM within the past six years

It is important to note that not all FSM children have Special Educational Needs, indeed these children represent a whole spectrum of attainment and ability. In planning how to spend our Pupil Premium funding, therefore, we review the needs of each eligible child and consider whether they would benefit from additional tutoring to help close any academic gaps that they have, and whether they would also benefit from direct financial support from the school so that they can access additional opportunities and experiences (both inside and beyond school).

The number of pupils eligible for Pupil Premium at Worthington Primary school is 16. Our Pupil Premium allocation for 2017/18 is £21,700.

Strategy	Funding allocation	Impact
Enrichment activities: Subsidise offsite trips and extra-curricular days	£320	This year the children have taken part in a farm visit, a WW2 evacuation day and a travelling museum. This has provided the children with first-hand experience in order to enhance their understanding of these topics.
Music lessons	£1330	Providing the children with the opportunity to develop a skill otherwise unavailable to them due to cost to parents.
After school clubs	£750	Children participate in after school clubs. Cost to parents may make these clubs prohibitive.

One to one specialist support: Catch up sessions & LSA support	£14,700.00	Children who are not at the expected level receive 1:1 catch up sessions.
Specialist Curriculum resources	£4600.00	Outdoor learning, communication and motor skills resources to support children in early years who have communication difficulties. These children can now be understood and are able to manipulate writing materials effectively.
